FIRES ON COMMON LAND ARE NOT ALLOWED

Why then does Goose Green, which is common land, have a dedicated fire pit?

S ome years ago the Commoners' Committee built a fire pit on Goose Green. Some questioned this because it is illegal to have fires on common land. This must therefore seem a rather odd thing for the Commoners to do, as the custodians of Goose Green, since our role is to uphold the values of common land.

So, why then did we build one? Before the pit was built there had been a number of campfires and disposable barbecues used at various places on the Green. This caused considerable damage to the grass which then took a long time to recover. For this reason we felt that if there were a designated area to have barbecues it would eliminate any future damage to the Green. The pit was built within the newly planted copse of chestnut trees at the north end of the Green and, as the trees grow, should provide a perfect place for informal gatherings. In fact, at the last Commoner's workday we tidied the seating area and reinstated some of the rotting logs around the pit.

AND IT WASN'T JUST GEESE!

We know we go on a lot in our newsletter about how lucky we are to live in Wolvercote. Well, Steve Goddard's superb talk 'Not Just Geese' in September about the bird life on Port Meadow and Wolvercote Common certainly reinforced that claim. We have on our doorstep the most amazing natural resource and for those interested in nature and not just birds, the Meadow and Common would be very hard to beat. Steve enlightened us about the fantastic variety of birds, both residents and just passing visitors, that can been seen during summer and winter. Although there

was so much to learn about the diversity and habits of the birds that can be seen, there was one fact which really stood out.

In any one year over 100 different species of birds visit the area — in fact the record so far is 130! There's not many places in the country that can boast that many visitors!
