#### So what does being a member involve?

The Wolvercote Commoners' Committee is a registered charity which took over the management of Wolvercote Common and Wolvercote Green from the Parish Council when it was disbanded in 1929. Anyone who is on the electoral roll within the old Wolvercote parish boundaries can stand for election to the Committee. Members give up some of their free time to serve voluntarily for a term of 3 years, and organise things like grant applications, thistle topping, control of invasive weeds, liaising with Network Rail and other adjoining landowners. They also represent all Commoners on the Port Meadow and Wolvercote Common Management Group, which coordinates across both Commons.

If you are on the electoral roll, within the old parish boundary\*, please come along, find out what the Committee has been doing, and consider standing for election to help preserve and manage these very special spaces for the benefit of all of us.
